

SOA Diversity Report

At the Society of Actuaries (SOA), our goal is for all members and candidates to feel fully included and have equitable opportunities to enter, develop, grow and succeed in the actuarial profession. The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee (DEIC) works closely with our leadership and staff to support the journey to increase diversity in membership and in the actuarial profession, as part of the SOA's Long-Term Growth Strategy. The DEIC created a framework of pillars, approved by the SOA Board of Directors, to focus efforts on cultivating equitable and inclusive experiences for members and candidates, growing the actuarial pipeline with an emphasis on supporting underrepresented groups, and championing Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) to serve the public interest through research.

The SOA strives for transparency and accountability in our DEI efforts. We are committed to sharing our demographic data and long-term goals to support our pledge and responsibility. We have collected member voluntary racial and ethnic demographic data since 2015.

"The release of the diversity reports this year, first in spring and now in fall, is one important step of many the SOA has taken in 2021 for DEI," said DEIC Chair Emily Hsu, FSA, CERA, FCIA. "Although voluntary race/ethnicity reporting increased from 27 percent last year to 30 percent this year, we are still far from where we want to be. We need everyone to be an advocate and complete their profile. Knowing

who you are helps us plan, meet your needs, and strive for a better future together."

"We are working to identify and develop more actions we can take to make the SOA and the profession a more diverse and inclusive place for all," said SOA CEO Greg Heidrich. "We promote a culture of belonging, opportunities for all, and believe that we can have a greater impact by disclosing our data and intentional goals for the future."

With current data collected, we present an infographic for the pathway from aspiring actuaries to members with ASA or FSA designations.

- Overall membership as of August 2021 for both the United States and worldwide
- New members from January 2011 through August 2021 in the United States
- New entrants to the examination pathway during January 2021 through August 2021 in the United States
- Volunteer and leadership participation during January 2021 through August 2021 worldwide; and
- Comparison Benchmark Demographic Data: United States population age 25 and up, insurance industry employees, and completed STEM bachelor's degrees.

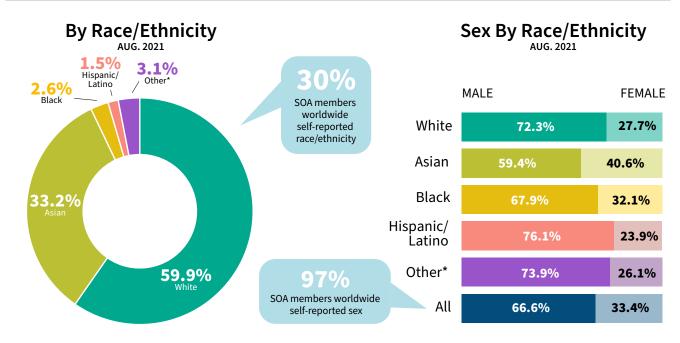

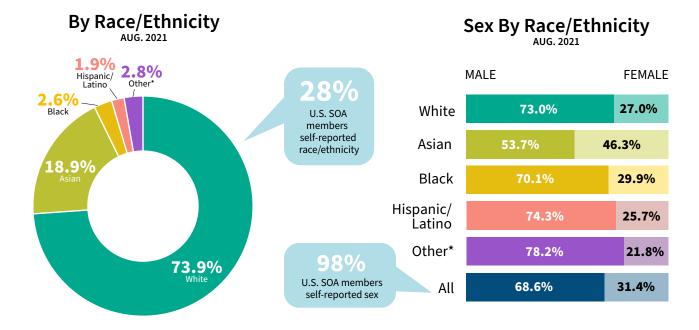
Membership – Worldwide

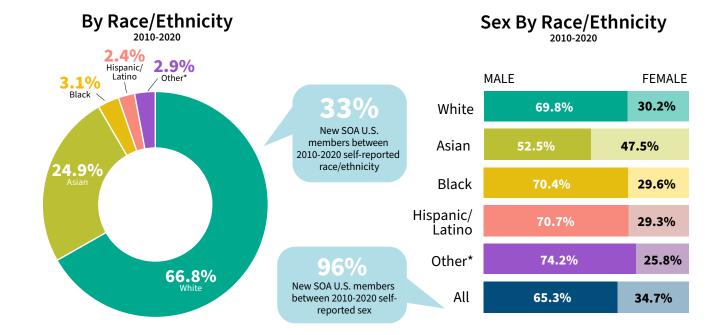

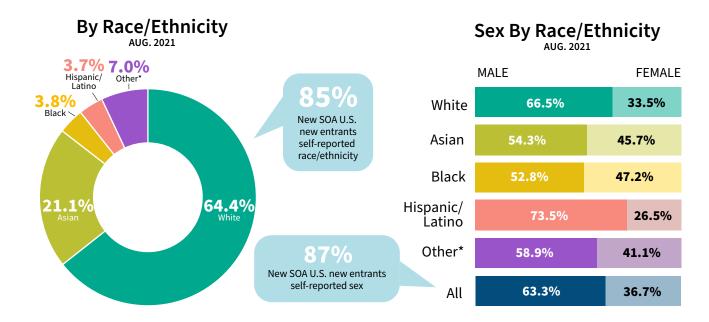
New Members – U.S.

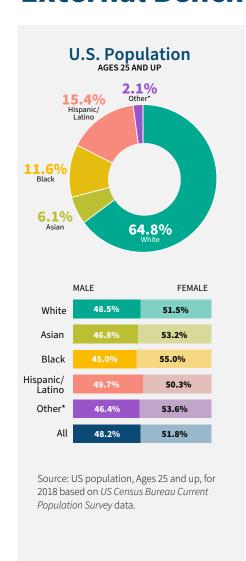


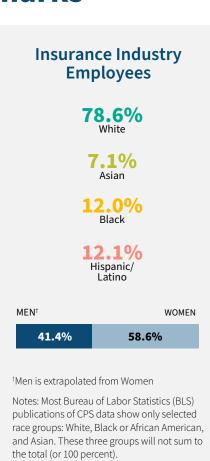

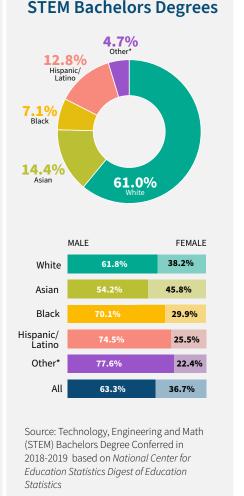

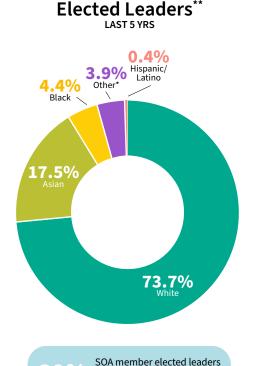


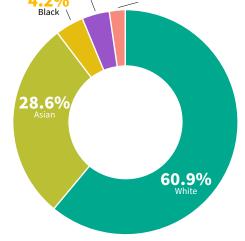

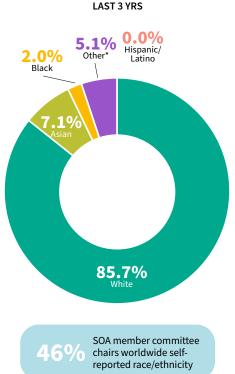

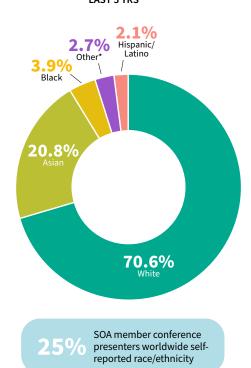

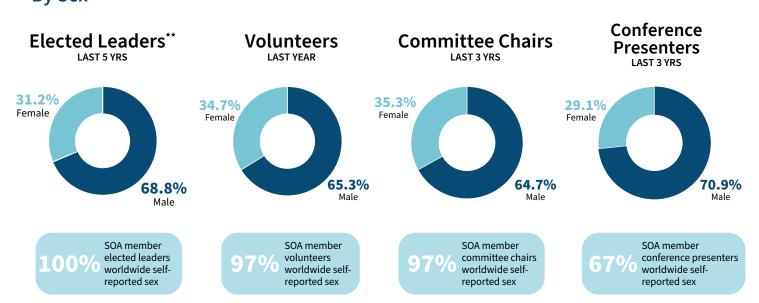
Conference Presenters LAST 3 YRS
